

a kitchen hand, librarian assistant, teacher aide, holiday camp instructor, teacher, playwright and artist.


3. What's the wackiest character you've made up in a story?



I always think I create very normal characters but it seems it is my mind that is a little wacky and people often see my characters as wackier


than I intended.
